Now Comes the petitioner SHANNON Williams, pro-se,
AND respectfully moves the for AN ORDER RELEASING the
petitioner from the custody of ERIC HOLDER U.S.
ATTORNEY GENERAL AND WARDEN JEFFREY NEWTON of the
Douglas County Dept. of Corrections.

IN support of this motion WE show that the
petitioner is being held in violation of the Klu Klux
KLAN ACT of 1865, the ORIGINAL Civil Rights Act.

This law sponsored by the SENATOR from MASSACHUSET
strictly forbid the enactment of ANY laws by white
men that ADVERSLY AFFECTED black men.

OVER 100 years later ANOTHER SENATOR, TIPONIEI
sponsored legislation that directly violated the
provisions of the Klu Klux KLAN Act of 1865, the
INHUMANE AND PATENTLY UNJUST CRACK COCAINE law of
1986.

It has BEEN WELL DOCUMENTED, studies have
BEEN DONE, TESTIMONY has BEEN presented before
Congress, during the last 23 years of the

disparate impact the CRACK COCAINE LAW HAS UPON BLACK MEN AND THE BLACK COMMUNITY AS A whole.

The ATTORNEY GENERAL ERIC HOLDER himself has STATED "This ADMINISTRATION firmly believes that the disparity in CRACK-AND POWDER-COCAINE SENTENCES is UNWARRANTED, CREATES A PERCEPTION OF UNFAIRNESS AND must be eliminated."

If this COURT finds this to be true it is in violation of the Klu Klux Klan Act which has NEVER BEEN OVERTURNED NOR WEAKENED. BLACK MEN HAVE ONLY this law to protect them from laws that ADVERSELY AFFECT their STATUS AS U.S. CITIZENS. NO LAW SINCE the Dred Scott DECISION has had more prejudicial Affect ON BLACK MEN than the 100-1 CRACK LAW of 1986.

The PETITIONER HAS SERVED OVER 13 YEARS ON A CRACK COCAINE CASE that would have BEEN ONLY 5 YEARS were it NOT for the unjust CRACK COCAINE LAW. That clearly VIOLATES the Klu Klux Klan Act of 1865.

Wherefore we pray that this COURT ORDER the IMMEDIATE RELEASE of the PETITIONER if it finds that the Anti Abuse Act of 1986 AS PERTAINS TO CRACK VIOLATES the SPIRIT & LETTER of the Klu Klux Klan Act of 1865.

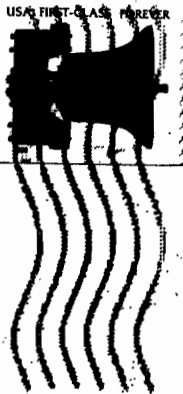
